In your mercy, forgive what we have been, help us to amend what we are, and direct what we shall be; that we may do justly, love mercy, and walk humbly with you; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The minister says

May the God of all healing and mercy forgive you and free you from all your sins, draw you to himself, and bring you pardon and peace now and forever. **Amen.**

Listening to the word Bible Reading: Isaiah 2:1-5
